BSPGHAN Strategy

The British Society of Paediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition (BSPGHAN) is the national society representing and supporting healthcare professionals and academics involved in the care of children and young people with gastrointestinal disorders. The membership comprises Consultant and trainee physicians, clinical and non-clinical academics and allied health professionals including nurses and nurse specialists, dieticians, pharmacists and others.

Council envisages four strategic priorities for 2025-2027:

1. Supporting members

- a) BSPGHAN is committed to equality, diversity and inclusion. Senior members are committed to supporting others through advocacy and / or mentoring as required. Initiatives to support the membership include periodic online forums/meetings to discuss complex cases to help responsible clinicians with clinical decision making. Examples include the regular intestinal failure forum and also the challenging cases meeting.
- b) The Society embraces a sense of belonging to BSPGHAN and of collaborative working within the Society to improve the care of our patients.

 Special Interest Working Groups will continue to develop National Guidance

in areas of importance.

- c) It is important the Society encourages the recruitment of trainees into gastroenterology posts. A variety of web based initiatives will be instituted to facilitate this process including signposts from the RCPCH website, information on training requirements, QR codes to join BSPGHAN and access to e-learning modules for members.
- d) The Society will strive to ensure its membership is actively participating in BSPGHANs activities, create an environment where members feel connected and ensure effective 2 way communication between the Council and the membership.

2. Education and Research

- a) In addition to the Annual meeting the Society will continue to support and develop online and other educational events encompassing clinical medicine and research methodologies.
- b) The Society will continue to offer BSPGHAN research grants within the constraints of the Society's budget
- c) The Chairs of the WGs and others will continue to modernise and update the clinical guidelines area of the Society's website. A subgroup of the Research and Education committees will continue its initiative to formally evaluate evidence based guidance







3. Raising Standards

- a) The Society is committed to its initiative to define and collect important datasets to inform Quality Standards (QS) and Key Performance Indicators (KPI). These data will be used to perform National Benchmarking and facilitate equity of access to Paediatric GI services nationally.
- b) The Society will continue to work with the RCP/JAG to finalise the paediatric global rating scale (pGRS) and advocate for its use in all paediatric endoscopy units to enable benchmarking.

- c) Facilitate and advocate for National collaborative QI projects driven by the various WGs.
- d) A re-audit of the QS recommendation published in 2022 will be undertaken..

4. Sustainability

- a) The Society will continue its efforts to minimise its carbon footprint through encouragement of hybrid models of working / meeting and increasing reliance of digital solutions.
- b) The Society (through the Endoscopy Working Group) will continue to examine the burden of endoscopy on the environment through national audit and subsequent guidance.
- c) The Society will continue its quest to ensure financial sustainability of the Society.







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
