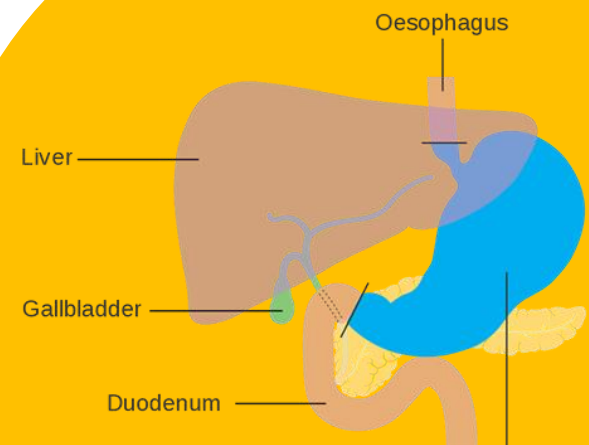
What Do We Do?
